A copy of your overseas orders may be required for participation. If there is a salon in your local area that you frequent, be sure to list the salon information. Also include a photo of yourself in uniform.

Please be advised that all information, letters, pictures etc. submitted to Military Mission Makeover (M.M.M.) become the property of M.M.M. In order to be eligible, you must provide the following:

- current head and shoulder picture, a picture of you in your military attire, pictures of you in the field (optional). Photos are used for preparation of makeover,
- you will be returning to the United States (if currently deployed),
- a reason why you would like to be considered for the Military Mission Makeover.

All soldiers selected must be in agreement with these terms and conditions:

1. All submissions become the property of M.M.M. and will not be returned.
2. Before and after pictures may be taken and edited to be used in any medium M.M.M. may choose.
3. Some soldiers may be featured in media coverage.
4. Please be advised not all applicants are guaranteed a makeover or spa day. These terms and conditions may also change depending on the location of the event. Soldiers will be chosen by availability in their area and by participating salons.


